3. All bidders are required to be registered with the **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Revenue Authority (KPR)** and **Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC)** for the Year 2021 - 22 in relevant Category & Field of Specialization.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

(Single Stage One Envelop E-Bidding System)

1. Financial Bid should be submitted online / electronically and CDR (in original) & other relevant documents should reach in this office in sealed envelope on or before the closing date & time.
2. Electronic Bids will be displayed Online on E-Bidding System after 30 minutes of closing time in the presence of bidders / their representatives who chose to be present.
3. The contractors quoting their bids up to a limit of 15% below Engineer estimate shall submit bid security to the extent of 2% of Engineer Estimate only. Bid Security (**2% of the Estimated Cost**) in the shape of Call Deposit (CDR) or Bank Guarantee (in original) shall be provided before closing time.
4. The contractors quoting their bids more than 15% below on Engineer's Estimate shall submit along with their bids an Additional Security to the extent of their bid/rates more than 15% below on engineer estimate in the form of percentage.
5. In case the bidder quotes more than 15% below the Engineer Estimate and the bid is not accompanied by the Additional Security then the bid shall be considered as non-responsive and the 2nd lowest bidder and so on will be considered accordingly.
6. In case a contractor quotes more than 30% below on Engineer Estimate, the procuring entity shall, in addition to additional security, require the contractor to produce detailed rate analysis of his bid price in relation to any or all the items of bill of quantities, scope of work, allocation of risks and responsibilities and/or any other requirements of the bid solicitation document. The contract shall be awarded to the lowest evaluated bidder who has satisfied the procuring entity on rate analysis. However, if the procuring entity determines that the contractor has failed to demonstrate its capability to execute the contract at the offered price, the matter shall be referred to the next higher authority for rejection of the bid on the basis of being financially unviable.
7. The procuring entity may offer the contract to next lowest bidder after due diligence in the context of financial difference between such two bids or may advertise procurement opportunity afresh.
8. The bidders are required to quote their rates (electronically) "ABOVE / BELOW / AT PAR" for both priced BOQ / Engineer Estimate based on **MRS-2021** and NSI Items as well. Only two digits after the decimal point shall be considered for evaluation purpose.
9. Any bidder who provides incorrect information shall stand disqualified & de-barred.
10. Time allowed for the completion of the work as specified in the NIT shall start from the issuance of Work Order.
11. Electronic Bids validity period is 90-days.
12. Successful Bidder should sign the agreement with the department within Twenty-one (21) days after issuance of Work Order.
13. Call Deposit and bank guarantee of Scheduled Banks shall be acceptable.
14. If the evaluated electronic bid costs of two or more than two bidders are equal then the successful bid will be declared through open bowl technique.
15. The employer has the authority to reject any bid or all the bids assigning cogent reasons.
16. Bid security of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd lowest bidders for each work will be retained by the Department till the approval of bid.
17. The successful bidder shall be subjected to all admissible taxes including stamp duty, service charges, sales tax & any other at prevailing rates.
18. The Contractor will deposit Performance Security *in shape of CDR / Bank Guarantee (valid for one year in case of Bank Guarantee)* within fourteen (14) days after receipt of Letter of Acceptance, in case the contract value is equal to or exceeds Rs. 20.00 million

All bidders are required to be registered with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Revenue Authority (KPRA) established under the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Finance Act, 2013 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. XXI or" 2013), for works, consulting and non-consulting services as listed in Schedule – II of the Act *ibid*.
